If you are going to submit your team, the casting office would like you to tape the exhibition using the [guidelines](#) included on the following pages. Once you complete the taping, follow the "taping tips" for Windows or Mac to digitize the video. The video must be smaller than 50mb. When you are ready to submit the audition, go to www.bringitonthecasting.com, and click "click here". You will need to fill out your coach or advisor's information, upload your video and team roster and submit.

Some Taping Tips:

- Make sure that the arena or stage is well lit.
- Record a test sample first and see how it looks and sounds on the computer first to make final adjustments before taping the exhibition.
- When you are ready to record the exhibition, it would be helpful to have someone from the team add a verbal "slate" first by saying their team name, and the city/country they are from.

By participating in this open casting call, you are not obligated to make any payments to ActorCast and the submission of the audition video is free of charge.

Submission Guidelines:

Now accepting auditions to appear as one of the international cheerleading teams in the next "Bring It On" movie.

- Prepare a Competitive Exhibition Style Routine.

- Tape and submit a video of your team's complete performance, along with a roster of the Team members, age, and contact information of your Cheer Advisor or Coach (telephone number, email address, city and country of residence). **ONLY ONE SUBMISSION PER TEAM**
- Team age requirement is 15 years or older
- The competition in the movie will be an "exhibition" and the producers for the movie will be looking for entertainment value, performance and the way in which the teams represent their country.
- We are looking for routines/performances that infuse a flavor of the country the team represents. International flavor can be expressed through flare, attitude, motions, stunts, dance gymnastics, props, appearance, costume, music or presentation. We are looking for an international flavor from each team, which will make it completely unique... not a rehash of western style cheer.
- Routines should be between 1:45 and 2:10 minutes long. The video file will need to be smaller than 50mb (please see 'taping tips' for Mac or Windows to prepare the file).
- Before or after the routine is presented, team members may talk about the team's history and why they should be considered for inclusion in the movie. Submissions should be performance quality with teams wearing their exhibition uniforms/costumes.
- Performing in front of a crowd is fine.
- Before the performance begins there should be a minimum of 10 seconds of a slate or sign with the team name on it and a contact number.
- The chosen teams will be filmed in their home country for final inclusion in the film.
- These initial audition submissions will be viewed only by the Producers so that we can narrow down to 20 Teams. **Submit anytime up until April 1, 2010**
- Thereafter, we will request the 20 Teams to resubmit a new routine in accordance with very specific instructions, for example, we will instruct the Teams to use certain music for their routine.
- These new submissions may be uploaded on the Internet and each performance may be voted on by the general public, not for the purpose of any contest, but rather for entertainment purposes only.
- The Producer will choose, from the 20 submitted, which 5 Teams will be included in the Picture, using various factors for consideration, all within their sole discretion.
- When submitting an audition video, do not include any of the following:
 1. Materials which include branded products such as clothing, toys, food with visible trademarks, brands or logos;

2. Materials with adult or offensive imagery/gestures/statements;
 3. Materials which contain alcohol products;
 4. Materials which reference phone numbers, addresses, or websites, besides team info
 5. Materials which contain images of license plates;
 6. Materials which contain derogatory characterizations of any ethnic, racial, sexual or religious groups;
 7. Materials that are prohibited under the website Terms of Use;
- We reserve the right not to accept and/or display any materials which do not conform to these guidelines or which do not adhere to the technical requirements specified on this website. We may modify or edit any materials, or request submitters to do so, in order for the materials to meet the accepted guidelines.
